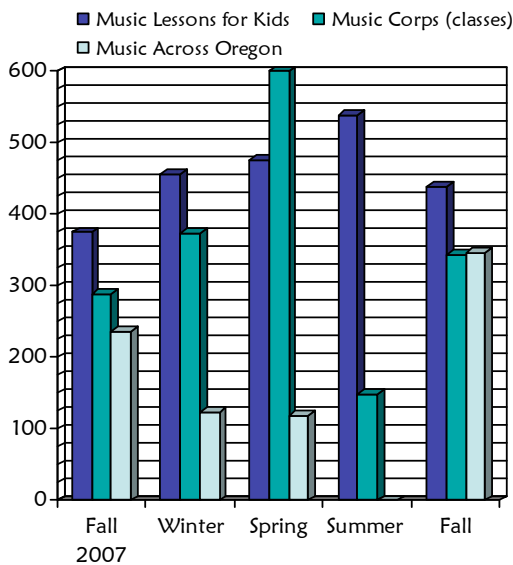




# Ethos Music Center's 2008 Program Report

In 2008, Ethos reached approximately **2,028** students (unduplicated) through private and small group music instruction and **over 2,000 additional** students with workshops and educational music assemblies.

## How We Serve

**Music Lessons 4 Kids (since 1999)** Along with teaching private and small group instruction on a variety of instruments this program also provided a Master Class with David Valdez, continued the Nike sponsored free Drop-In Hip-Hop Lab, started an inter-generational women's choir, added a number of new student Rock Bands, sent violin students to Guadalajara, Mexico as ambassadors for Portland, and was able to increase the number of scholarships to students on free lunch.

**Music Corps/Sound School (since 2000)** This program brought small and large group instruction, workshops, to 25 different schools and community centers and assemblies to 12 different sites. New class offerings included samba (batucada), African drumming and dance, and marimba. Also, Vernon elementary contracted Ethos to run a 9 wk program where every student k-8 received at least 1 hour a week of music class.

Ethos taught **344** different small group classes in 2008!  
(each class runs for 8-10 wks or 8-10 hours)

**Music Across Oregon (since 2002)** Two new Rural Music Facilitator sites were added which enabled Ethos to extend year-long service to Monument and Long Creek, Oregon. Also, all four RMFs taught units on Gypsy Jazz which was followed up by interactive music assemblies by Portland based Pete Krebs Gypsy Jazz Trio.

## Who We Serve

Dedicated to making music accessible to all youth, Ethos students come from a variety of different socio-economic levels and represent many different cultures and ethnicities. Although we are focused on K-12 education, we also have a number of adults and a growing number of pre-k and toddler students.

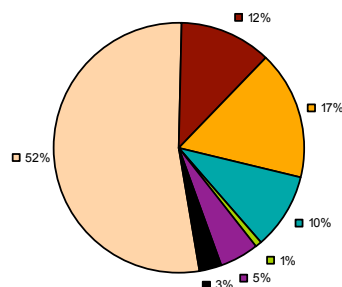

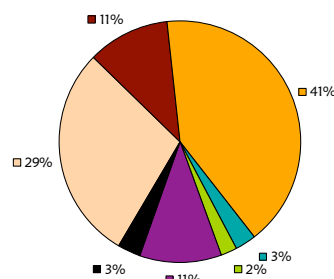

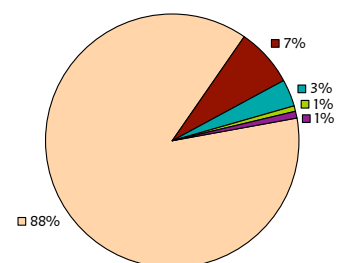

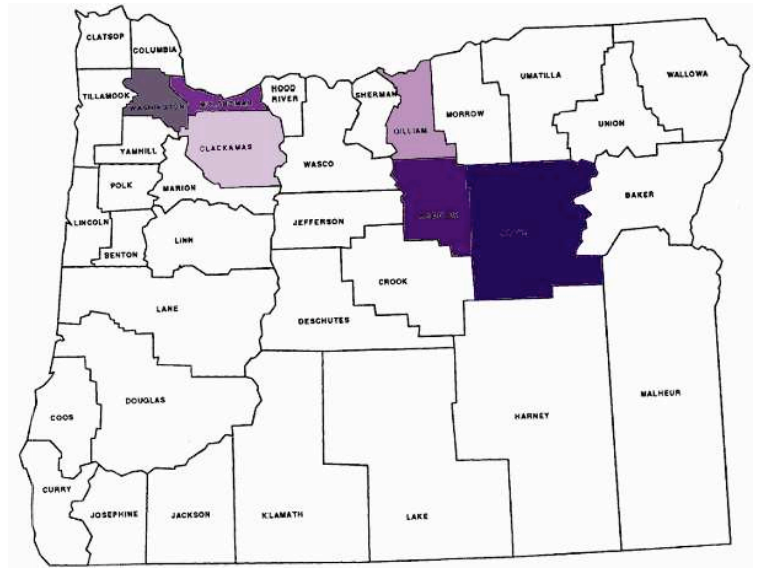

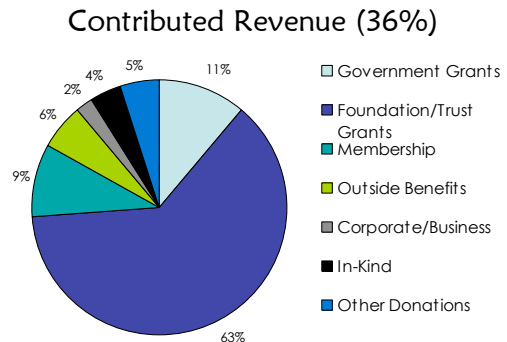
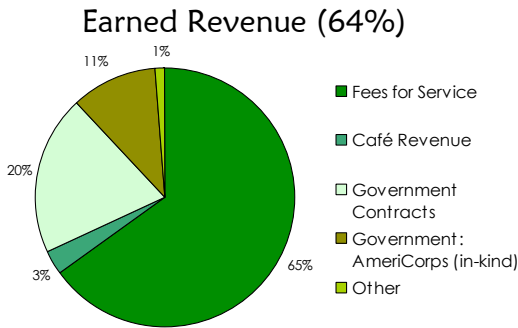


Counties served in 2008: Multnomah, Gilliam, Wheeler, Grant, Washington, Clackamas, and Clark county in Washington.

## Sources of Support & Expense Breakdown

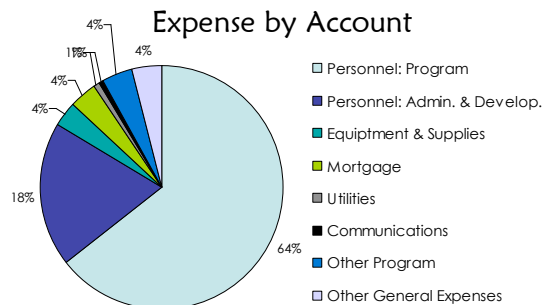
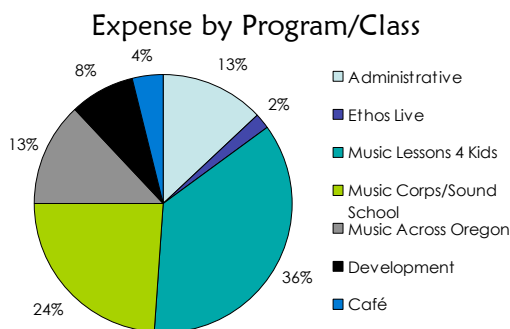
### Revenue for 2008
