## Financial Assistance\*

Students under 18 years of age who qualify to participate in the Free or Reduced Price Lunch Program at school are automatically eligible for discounted rates on classes and lessons at Ethos. Please include a letter from your child's school documenting their participation in the Free or Reduced Price Lunch Program along with your registration and payment. If your child is home-schooled or in a school that does not participate in the Free/Reduced Price Lunch Program, please include proof of income in the form of last year's income tax form and recent pay stub. The Scholarship committee will then contact you to determine the cost of lessons.

**Toddler / Preschool:** Reduced rates available based on proof of need (Food Stamps, Oregon Health Plan, Head Start, etc.).

**Group Classes:** If your child is eligible for reduced price lunch at school, the fee for group lessons is \$60 per term. If your child is eligible for free lunch at school, the fee is \$30 per term.

**Ensemble Classes:** If your child is eligible for reduced price lunch at school, the fee for group lessons is \$40 per term. If your child is eligible for free lunch at school, the fee is \$30 per term.

**Private Lessons:** If your child is eligible for reduced price lunch at school, the fee for 8 private lessons is \$92. If your child is eligible for free lunch at school, the fee is \$70. (Prices based on 30 minute lessons)

# PRIVATE LESSONS FOR KIDS AND ADULTS - AGE 5 AND UP

Weekly private lessons are available for students on nearly every instrument and skill level and are set up to fit your schedule. Private lessons are offered year-round and can start at anytime. Ethos offers Private Lessons in 8-lesson packages. Most students start with 30 minute lessons.

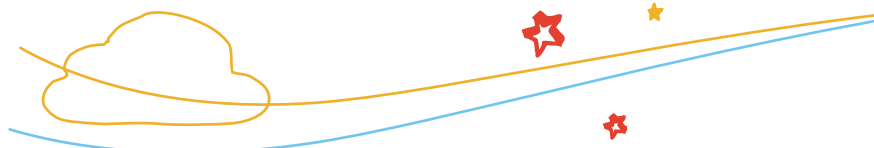

## ENSEMBLES CLASSES FOR KIDS & ADULTS

**KIDS CHOIR / VOCAL ENSEMBLE** – Singers will learn basic musicianship skills such as sight reading and ear training, and learn how to sing like themselves while making new friends that also love to sing. Students in this class learn creative warm-up exercises and fun techniques to develop the voice, work as a group on harmony, dynamics and rhythm, and practice a fun and challenging repertoire of classics and contemporary selections. Vocal Ensemble performs multiple times throughout the year at recitals, holiday concerts and other outside events. **Class held at Ethos@IFCC.**

**BEGINNERS ROCK ENSEMBLE** - For students 8-12. *Students must have at least one year of experience on their instrument in order to sign up for this class.* Part orchestra, part rockband, the students learn to play together in a large rock orchestra, focusing on classical melodies as well as modern rock favorites. Electric rock instruments are welcome (electric guitar, bass, keyboard and drums) and collaborations with the Ethos band class are in store. Students will learn the basics of reading sheet music, playing as an ensemble, and rocking out! This class is an excellent introduction to Ethos' RockBand classes.

## DANCE AND MUSIC CLASSES

**CREATIVE DANCE** - Creative Dance gives students an opportunity to gain awareness of music, rhythm, and movement. Activities are designed to develop strength, coordination, creative thinking, and expression. Through classroom activities, children refine motor skills and develop the creative process through the use of props and imagery.

**SIGHT-READING WITH WESTERN SOLFÈGE / IMPROVISING WITH INDIAN SARGAM** – Solfège was developed during the 11th century in Italy as a tool for helping singers to read notated music. Sargam has a 3,000 year-old tradition as the cornerstone of Indian music’s development for oral transmission, pedagogy, and performance. This class will be a fun, creative, and engaging exploration of these two tools. Learning these systems will help with sight-reading, intonation, improvisation and composition. No experience is needed in either system.

## REGISTRATION

Registration is required for participation in any Ethos activity and must be completed before lessons, ensembles, or classes begin. Completed registration forms with full payment should be sent or hand delivered to 2 N Killingsworth Street, Portland, Oregon, 97217. Checks and money orders should be made payable to Ethos Music Center. Please do not send cash. There is a \$20 returned check fee.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

To apply for financial assistance, include a letter from your child's school documenting their participation in the free or reduced price lunch program. **Toddler/Preschool:** Reduced rates available based on proof of need (Food Stamps, Oregon Health Plan, Head Start, ect.). **Group Classes:** If your child is eligible for reduced price lunch, the fee for group lessons will be \$60 per term. If your child is eligible for free lunch, the fee will be \$30 per term. **Ensemble Classes:** If your child is eligible for reduced price lunch, the fee for ensemble classes will be \$40 per term. If your child is eligible for free lunch, the fee will be \$30 per term. **Private Lessons:** If your child is eligible for reduced price lunch, the fee for 8 private lessons will be \$92. If your child is eligible for free lunch, the fee will be \$70. Your request for financial aid will not be considered unless the full payment, the completed registration form, and the school letter are received by the registration deadline. If your child is home schooled or in a school that does not participate in the free lunch program, please include proof of income in the form of last year's income tax form and a recent pay stub. Ethos staff will then contact you to determine the cost of lessons.

In order to make good progress, you will need to do the following: Attend lessons regularly and be on time; Practice everyday in a quiet place; Remember that quality of practice is as important as quantity; Keep your music and instrument in good order and bring both to lessons; Talk to your teacher about your goals and how to achieve them; Care for Ethos' instruments; Attend live music performances at every opportunity; Enjoy yourself and remember to take pride in being a student of music.

## PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITIES

Parents and guardians are solely responsible for picking up their children from and taking their children directly to designated Ethos classrooms and instructors. Ethos also strongly encourages parents and guardians to participate with their children by taking an interest in their musical endeavor. Parents and adult students will be required to cover the cost of repair or replacement of any damaged Ethos instruments if the damage was caused by them or their children. Adult music lessons are also offered through Ethos Music Center.

## ATTENDANCE

Students must pay for all lessons in the course, regardless of attendance. **Students must notify their teacher at least 24 hours in advance of any absence.** Make-up lessons are not required unless proper notification is given and are at the discretion of the teacher. Teacher cancellations will be made up by arrangement between the students and teacher.

## CANCELLATION AND REFUNDS

**Private Lessons** – (See 24hr cancellation policy under Attendance\*) If a student wishes to discontinue lessons at any point Ethos will refund any remaining lesson credits provided the request is made at least 24 hours before a scheduled lesson.

**Group Classes** – Ethos offers a full refund up until the first day of class. If enrollment is cancelled after the first class a 90% refund will issued, after the second class a 70% refund will be issued and after the third or fourth class a 50% refund will be issued. Ethos does not refund for classes that have occurred, but were missed by the student. After the 5th class Ethos will not refund any of your group class registration payment.

**Summer Camps** – Ethos offers a full refund up to one week before the first day of the camp that you are registered for. Students that cancel with less than one week will receive ½ refund for their payment. Once the camp has started, Ethos will not offer any refund if you miss or withdraw.

We anticipate opening up this new venture in March of 2011 after some minor renovations including a 4,000 square foot ecoroof and a new exterior.
